

In mid-November, the team had played 14 games and was sitting in first place in the Manitoba Major Junior Hockey League (MMJHL). The team had a ten-game winning streak due in part to the play of their rookie goalie, Sage Delaronde. Sage joined the Express this year after finishing his highschool hockey career with Murdoch MacKay Collegiate. He was also named the leagues' top rookie and goalie for the month of October with a save percentage of .940 and goals against of 1.82. 

## **Transcona Garden Club**

Gardening season has not ended, it has just changed locations. Fall seems to have extended quite a bit from when I first began gardening. Each year we seem to have more time to complete outdoor chores and to get decorations up in decent temperatures.

There I was, surrounded by bags and bags of leaves for mulch and the ground not yet frozen, at time of writing. Mulching seems like good insurance, especially for "young" gardens, with perennials not yet well-established. There is no sure way of knowing the length or severity of the coming winter. Having done all that we could to ensure our plants are protected, we can turn our attention to other things.

Indoor gardens can be anything from a few resident houseplants to shelves of succulents and other plants which we cannot let go. So in they come, and with some special attention, most will survive and perhaps even thrive, dependant on thoughtful care. Checking for hitch-hiking pests, restricting watering and fertilizing is generally good practice. Bulbs, e.g. oxalis may flower year-round in good light, and regular watering. Amaryllis

need a period of dormancy. Mandevilla may need trimming, some leaf drop is normal. Check Hibiscus for aphids. Christmas cactus need a cool dark spot to set their buds for flowering. Orchids require a 5 to 10 degree drop in temperature to prepare them for blooming. Succulents need only enough water to prevent them from shrivelling. Many houseplants originated where their summer is our winter, and may need special attention. Familiar Aloes come in many attractive forms, requiring sandy soil, very little water, bright natural light, and even do well without fertilizer. We can control the temperature somewhat by turning down the thermostat, and providing extra lights. Think of little-used rooms, dark closets, any place away from heating vents for the cactus and bulbs. What is the best thing about indoor gardening? -NO MOSQUITOS!

The same techniques would apply to live material, only wet floral oasis instead of the dry one.

The March of Dimes Canada, a national organization dedicated to supporting individuals with disabilities, offers a valuable resource to enhance home safety in Manitoba: The Safe and Healthy Home for Seniors Grant.

## What is the Safe and Healthy Home for Seniors Grant?

Funded by the Government of Manitoba's Department of Health, Seniors and Long-Term Care, the Safe and Healthy Home for Seniors Program provides funding for basic and essential devices or adaptations for seniors facing barriers within their homes. The goal of the program is to create an accessible, barrier-free living space where a low-moderate income senior with a condition or limitation can complete basic activities of daily living (eating, bathing, toileting, transferring, and mobility) or getting in and out of their home to access essential medical care and community services safely, independently and with dignity.

#### Who Can Apply?

An eligible Applicant must: be a permanent Manitoba Resident, be 65 years of age or older, have a combined net household income of under \$60,000, have a permanent ongoing or recurring condition/limitation that impedes mobility and results in substantial restrictions in activities of daily living (eating, bathing, toileting, transferring, and mobility) and/or getting in and out of your home to access essential medical care or community services. If Eligible, an applicant may apply for:

• Up to \$5,000 for basic and essential accessibility solutions, every three years, to a lifetime maximum of \$15,000.

• Up to \$6,500 for basic and essential accessibility solutions if the applicant resides in a rural or remote area of Manitoba, every three years, to a lifetime maximum of \$15,000

#### What Types of Modifications Can Be Funded?

The grant can cover a wide range of modifications, depending on the specific needs of the applicant. Some of the most common improvements include:

**Ramp Installation**: For individuals using wheelchairs or walkers, ramps provide safer access to homes and reduce the risk of falls associated with steps or curbs.

**Bathroom Modifications**: Installing grab bars, non-slip flooring, bath seats and zero threshold showers can greatly enhance bathroom safety, preventing slips and falls.

**Stairlifts and Elevators**: For those living in multi-story homes, stairlifts or residential elevators provide a safer alternative to navigating stairs.

**Widened Doorways**: Wider doorways allow for easier passage of mobility devices, such as wheelchairs or walkers, making the home more accessible.

Other Accessibility Devices: Modifications to door handles and light switches, can also be funded to ensure ease of access and movement throughout the home.

## How to Apply for the Home Safety Grant?

## **Over a Year of Progress – Improving Healthcare for Radisson**

As Manitobans prepare for winter, marked by holiday celebrations and the seasonal spread of colds and flus, many are also grappling with rising costs. High grocery prices and interest rates have made it harder for families to manage their finances. Affordability and healthcare are top of mind for Manitobans, and these are the priorities of our government. Elected with a clear mandate to make life more affordable and rebuild our healthcare system, we are working every day to address these challenges.

tems. We are also committed to making homeownership more accessible for Manitobans.

Since taking office, we have prioritized rebuilding healthcare by listening to frontline workers through a comprehensive listening tour. As part of this effort, I have spent much of the past year visiting personal care homes, meeting with seniors, and listening to their concerns. We are investing in restoring services, addressing seniors' needs, and working to establish a Seniors' Advocate Office, despite opposition blocking progress since March.

In addition to improving the quality of care, we have expanded healthcare capacity across the province. We have opened two new extended-hours primary care clinics at Concordia and Grace Hospitals and expanded the sexual assault nurse examiner program to provide trauma-informed care. We are also adding new staffed beds, launching a mobile MRI service for Northern Manitoba, and expanding spinal surgery programs to reduce wait times and improve care.

To support these efforts, we are hiring 1,000 new healthcare workers to meet growing demand. Despite the budget deficit left by the previous government, we are committed to balancing the budget while making essential investments in healthcare, job creation, and sustainability.

At the heart of our efforts is the belief that every Manitoban deserves access to affordable healthcare and a decent standard of living. As we head into the holiday season, our government remains committed to making life better for all Manitobans. �




